## BUFFALO! What's in Buffalo?

The Hyatt Regency ([www.buffalo.hyatt.com](http://www.buffalo.hyatt.com)) in Buffalo, New York, is the site for the Ehlers-Danlos National Foundation's Annual Learning Conference in 2004, and what a wonderful site it is!

- Direct access to the Metro Rail ([www.nfta.com](http://www.nfta.com)) is just a few steps out the Main Street entrance. Once on the Metro Rail you will ride above ground free of charge up and down Main Street as you head over to Dunn Tire Park to catch a Buffalo Bison's ([www.bisons.com](http://www.bisons.com)) baseball game or down to the Erie Basin Marina and the Buffalo & Erie County Naval and Military Park ([www.buffalonaivalpark.org](http://www.buffalonaivalpark.org)).
